The Merrimack Valley Substance Use Disorder Symposium was designed to create an environment in which Merrimack Valley SU providers across the spectrum of engagement can meet, network, build relationships, and learn about specific community issues, local resources and best practices.

Since 2018, the Symposium has attracted close to 1,000 attendees, many of which provide direct care services in the substance use disorder field. The feedback has been overwhelming positive, and has really shown us how desperately this event is needed on an annual basis.

The 2021 MVSUDS planning partners are calling for workshop proposals that offer unique educational experiences for professionals in the fields of addiction, treatment, and behavioral health. Our goal is to facilitate an environment in which Merrimack Valley SUD providers across the spectrum of engagement learn about our communities' local resources, provide education on best practices and also for people to experience educational, informative, inspirational, professional development. Others will benefit from your experience while you make a valuable contribution to the profession.

In 2021, the Merrimack Valley Substance Use Disorder Symposium planning committee is seeking current and relevant information within these topics:

Integrating Technology, Co-Occurring Disorders, Clinical Skills, Recovery Support (Clinical) Education/INCASE, Peer Recovery (Non-Clinical), Psychopharmacology, Community justice, Provider self-care, Suicide awareness/prevention, prevention, Youth Services, School-based Diversion programs and Harm Reduction

Proposals for the 2021 Symposium must link presentation content and learning objectives to previously mentioned topic areas. Additionally, we are particularly interested in presentations which offer:

- Leading-edge information and emerging trends in the field substance use disorder;
- Practical strategies for improvement and innovative, non-traditional approaches;
- "How to" best practices and case studies, including tangible implementation tool(s) and
- Demonstration of measurable impact and use of effectiveness measures/metrics.

Logistics

Each session will last **60** minutes. We encourage you to leave time at the end for questions.

The Symposium will max out at 350*. Because of space constraints, some sessions will be set in theater style (chairs only; no tables) for maximum occupancy as deemed by the facility and in accordance with local fire safety codes. Presenters should anticipate an audience size of approximately 30 to 120 people per session (more in some cases), and should design their presentation approaches with the facility logistics in mind. Please note that we are unable to modify or alter seating arrangements/set-ups for individual sessions. Rooms are equipped with standardized audio-visual: projection unit/screen and a microphone; any other A/V needs are arranged for by the presenter.
